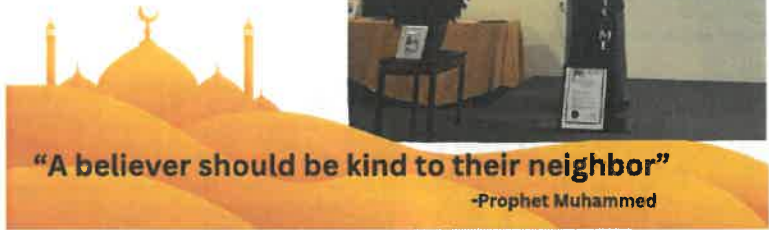

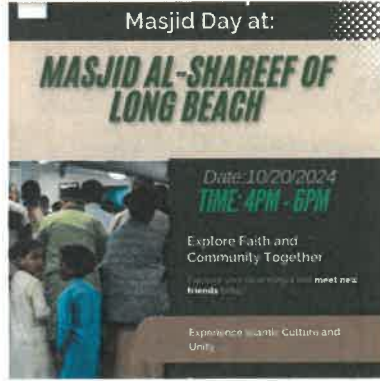

## THE INAUGURAL DAY OF FAITH & HARBOR COMMUNITY POLICE

The Inaugural Day of Faith (based organization leaders meeting with LAPD) at Harbor Community Police Station was held on the 8th of October. It started with a welcome and opening prayer from Chaplain Ed Beardsley and was then followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Next was a beautiful acapella of “America the Beautiful” by his daughter, after this the Pastor of Powerhouse Church Bob Andrade performed his own rendition of the National anthem consisting of trumpet, acapella & sprechstimme. The meeting emphasized the faith relationship with LAPD and the importance of community.

Firstly, the Captain III Brent McGuyre stressed that he encourages staff to prioritize in order – faith, family and work. He sees his role as a shepherd or a sheepdog, protecting citizens from “the wolves.” The Captain advised that they have a Sikh officer and continue to have regular interfaith services.

McGuyre believes that a “faith leader is someone that the community looks up to “to serve.” He asks for the community to pray for police officers and the flag. He stated that the job takes its toll, case in point, about seventy to seventy-five percent of (police department) marriages end in divorce in comparison to normal rate of fifty percent and he mentioned that officers are two to three times more likely to descend into alcoholism. Also, along with the risk to their physical safety in line of duty there is an increased rate of suicide. He ended his speech with a request for the community to pray for their personal lives too. Next up was Sargent Bill Manlove the Community Relations Officer who advised that Senior lead officer (SLO) was the point of contact for crimes and of quality-of-life issues in their respective areas. The following HDLAPD officers shared the following information. Brian Price (SLO), pointed out their main issues were homelessness, food injustice, unemployment, grand theft auto and added

many churches in Wilmington call about abandoned vehicles. Jackie Lopez (SLO) declared “if we (the police) know more (from citizens) we can help more” to keep our community safe. Junior Nua (SLO) facilitates an Active Shooter training (Run, Hide, Fight program) in which he provides training at churches, companies, hospitals and high schools for active shooter preparedness, even though the chances of it happening are extremely low. That said, he specifically said prevention is key and fifty six percent of shooters left information (leakage), and for public to act on information. This is called active bystandership, not snitching but respectful reporting to save lives with information from social media, conversations with shooters etc. Rich Lee (SLO) gave his testimony how God was part of his life and police application process and expressed how his sister prayed the Prayer of Discernment for and with him daily to see, feel, and hear what he needs to. He asserted whilst his job is important the “Pastor is pillar in a strong community.” Melodie Shortle (SLO) reminded us to lock doors and importance of reaching out to the youth. Detective Donald who specializes in property crime, vandalization and, burglary. He himself was at his home church office in San Pedro when a burglar came to steal music equipment and emphasized the importance of an activated alarm system, with a time limit, in addition to a working camera system is imperative. Detective Ybarra said that prayers are important for their day to day lives, and said “we need it for we are at God’s grace and mercy.” He stressed that hate crimes take priority. Emily Ortega, leads the Youth Cadet Program, that turn youth into great leaders, with public speaking, critical thinking, and community events. Their focus on “better to give than receive” to create future positive role models. Also following the meeting there were booths for Harbor Connect, Fellowship Christian Athletes, Pastoral Prayer Fellowship, Father-con, and a Community Mental Health Representative. Ending this community engagement effort, the Commander Whiteman stated there are not enough police, and it’s important to stabilize region for community wellness, and to come together with a collective solution to treat the root and cause of issues. The Harbor division serves the communities of San Pedro, Wilmington Harbor City and Harbor Gateway. An SLO map can be found on the bulletin board.

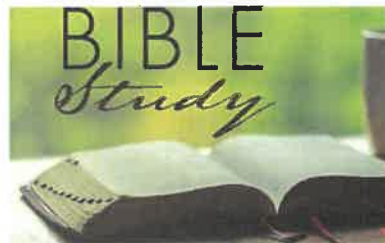

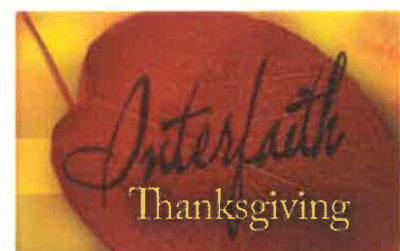

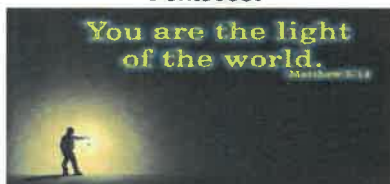
